What would make it better on campus?

- Create a stronger community amongst our black students, faculty and staff to be able to network and connect we need that sense of community to help as you have a community that understands what you are experiencing
- BFAPA has the potential to be a powerful thing
- Perhaps when there were so few it was easier to stay close or have we gotten a feeling of being too safe? Now that we have 2-3 times the number on campus we are even more silo-ed How can we get back to what we had (i.e. conflicting events targeted at the same audience)
- Think strategically about creating a space to share the dialogue and experiences with other on campus remember the force of numbers matters
