












## Astronaut Michael S. Hopkins, a U. of I. alumnus, to be Commencement speaker





CHAMPAIGN, III. — Alumnus Michael S. Hopkins, a U.S. astronaut who recently spent 166 days orbiting Earth in the International Space Station, will deliver the Commencement address at the University of Illinois on May 17 (Saturday).

Hopkins, who earned an aerospace engineering degree at Illinois in 1991, graduated from NASA's astronaut candidate training program in 2011. In March he touched down on Earth after orbiting the planet more than 2.500 times and participating in two space walks.

This year's university commencement speaker has quite a story to tell.

It was only a matter of fixing a time and a place for the University of Illinois to bring back one of its most accomplished graduates.

The UI this week scored big on both counts, announcing that astronaut and former Fighting Illini football co-captain Mike Hopkins will be the speaker during the May 17 commencement ceremonies at Memorial Stadium.

Hopkins indicated he was both surprised and honored by the invitation, wondering initially if it was genuine. It's the UI and the local community that is honored by Hopkins' presence on that most important and symbolic day.

The 44-year-old Hopkins recently returned from a six-month stint in the International Space Station, participating in scientific experiments with Russian cosmonauts and going on two space-walks to conduct repairs. Hopkins also found time during his space adventure to speak to a UI class and film promotion spots for UI athletics.

Suffice it to say, he will bring an impressive resume and a local-boy-makes-good reputation to his UI audience. Indeed, his personal story is a testimonial to the importance of combining talent, hard work and a resolute determination to succeed. Hopkins' example is exactly what UI graduates as well as their friends and family should see on graduation day.

## NASA astronaut discusses future of space program








Mike Hopkins talking to reporters at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign on Friday, May 16, 2014.


