PROFICIENCY EXAMINATION INFORMATION

To receive proficiency credit for MUS 173, the student must be able to pass a comprehensive keyboard examination showing mastery of all areas taught during the course.

Procedures

- 1. Obtain the current text for the course (see required materials below).
- 2. Thoroughly prepare and practice all areas outlined on this sheet.
- 3. Sign up for a 10-minute proficiency exam according to the posted schedule: http://publish.illinois.edu/musicresources/undergrad-placement-and-proficiency/
- 4. Students should only take this exam if they have (1) passed the MUS 172 proficiency exam, or (2) completed MUS 172. Students who fail this exam need to register for MUS 173 during their freshman year.

MUS 173 Proficiency Exam Materials

(1) Harmonization

Harmonize examples 1-5 on pages 310-312.

(2) Transposition

- 1. Transpose as indicated examples 1-8 on pages 326-329.
- 2. Build any mode and transpose as asked (page 318).
- 3. Build each whole tone scale and pentatonic scale (page 228).
- 4. Build the C blues scale and transpose to F (page 229).

(3) Sight-reading

Sight-read examples at the level of those on pages 269-272.

(4) Key Signatures and Chord Patterns

- 1. Build augmented and diminished triads on any given tone (page 227).
- 2. Identify all major and minor key signatures.
- 3. Transpose to all major keys the following chord progressions:
 - ii7-V7-I7 (page 306).
 - I-vi-IV-ii-I6/4-V7-I (page 218).
 - I-IV-V7/V-V7-I (page 261).

(5) Technique

- 1. Construct each form of the minor scale on any given note (page 267).
- 2. Play <u>all</u> major scales and arpeggios, hands together, two octaves, in a fluent tempo and with correct fingering (see *Appendix B Parts 1 and 2*, pages 359-367).
- 3. Play the chromatic scale in contrary motion with correct fingering (page 258, top of page).

(6) Piano Ensemble Repertoire and Accompanying Selections

Fluently perform the student part on pages 280-281 and 290-291.

(7) Solo Repertoire

- 1. Fluently perform the piano compositions on pages 346-353.
- 2. Using damper pedal properly, play the Wagner excerpt, No. 9 on page 234.
