

Students in this course will study and experience the cultural and linguistic diversities of India and understand how a multicultural and multilingual India is being impacted by globalization, both economic and cultural. The course will enable students to experience the three distinct realities of India – rural/tribal, urban, and metropolitan. While in India, students will get opportunities to interact with local students, people, officials, and professionals from diverse fields. Students interested in or pursuing research on specific topics related to the culture and languages of India will be encouraged to focus on their chosen interest or research in their required paper and poster for this course.
