EPSY 201

This is the basic undergraduate course in Educational Psychology that explores fundamental issues of development, learning, instruction, and assessment. This course articulates how people learn, how they are influenced by cultural and social contexts, how to assess learning and its outcomes, and how best to teach and motivate people to achieve. Educational psychologists attempt to improve learning in a broad range of settings, from school classrooms to professional work environments.

Prerequisite: Psych 100

Students will be required upon request to participate in a total of 3 hours of experiments outside of class. Students enrolling in a discussion/recitation section will automatically be enrolled in the lecture.

Discussion sections are organized by age growth periods. Students interested in the development of young children, aged 0-10, should enroll in sections AD1, AD2, or AD3. Students interested the development of adolescents, 11-14 year-olds, should enroll in sections AD4, AD5, or AD6. Students interested in the development of adolescents, 15-19 year-olds, should enroll in sections AD7, AD8, or AD9. Students interested in development across the lifespan should enroll in sections ADA, ADB, or ADC.
