

## The noun classes and the definite and indefinite articles

Noun class	Name example	Definite ( <b>THE</b> )	Indefinite ( <b>A</b> )	
<b>m-</b>	Muus = cat	<b>Muus mi</b>	<b>Am muus</b>	
<b>g-</b>	Ginaar = chicken	<b>Ginaar gi</b>	<b>Ag ginaar</b>	
<b>w-</b>	Waañ = kitchen	<b>Waañ wi</b>	<b>Aw waañ</b>	
<b>b-</b>	Saag = bag	<b>Saag bi</b>	<b>Ab saag</b>	
		<b>NAME + THE</b>	<b>A + NAME</b>	

**NB:**

The noun classes are different in the singular form. However, they have the same plural forms. The plural of the definite articles (mi , bi , gi , wi , etc.) is **yi**. The plural form of the indefinite articles (am, ab, ag, aw, etc.) is **ay**. See the table below for more details.

Examples of definite	English translation	Examples of indefinite	English translation
<b>Muus yi</b>	The cats	<b>Ay muus</b>	Cats
<b>Ginaar yi</b>	The chickens	<b>Ay ginaar</b>	Chickens
<b>Waañ yi</b>	The kitchens	<b>Ay waañ</b>	Kitchens
<b>Saag yi</b>	The bags	<b>Ay saag</b>	Bags
